Dear Reader

At Pentecost we think of the disciples who went to proclaim the message of HOPE to humanity. That message is so important for those in the Holy Land at the present time and especially for the children. Conditions do not improve, indeed get worse, but the help you have given via CNT has been tremendous.

In the financial year ending May 2004 donations surged to £106,000. We sent £103,000 to the Holy Land. Details of the projects we have supported are listed in this newsletter. His Beatitude Michel Sabbah, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, his teachers, the parents and the children are so grateful for your contributions. This year's result is fantastic; well done to all who helped to raise funds.

Your trustees are very conscious of the need to monitor the developments you are sponsoring and have been on pilgrimage to see what has been achieved. Indeed David Smith visited no less than seven schools in Jordan and Palestine at Easter so we are well aware of the difficulties faced by the communities and schools. One dilemma is the emigration of Christian families and that by providing a good education it may create greater emigration. Balanced against this is surely the human right for a good education and the impact such an education will have on a person's overall development. The other dilemma is which schools do we support and in this selection we are guided by those in the Latin Patriarchate.

When we began this special initiative in December 2001 we chose three schools - **Hashmi; Fuheis and Beit Sahour**. Your contributions have had a dramatic effect by providing equipment, ensuring vital improvements to the schools and giving support to the many families by paying school fees. The three schools are now well equipped BUT there is a need for the continuing sponsorship of their pupils and teachers. We have also supported several other projects.

For the coming year we are continuing our sponsorship of students and teachers at the three schools Hashimi, Beit Sahour and Fuheis and in addition adopting two other schools for projects at Jifna, near Jerusalem and Zarka in Jordan.

We congratulate those individual parishes and schools who have made such efforts in funding special projects and we welcome this type of initiative but please do let us know so that we can advise on the most urgent projects. Please think about an appeal in Advent or Lent.

Finally we ask you to continue your support and to pray for peace in the Holy Land.

CNT Educational Sponsorship Scheme

£106,000 donated in financial year ending May 2004; brings total to £219,000 raised and £188,120 sent out to the Holy Land schools during 2002 to 2004.

Holy Land Schools benefit from surge in donations that pay for more projects which improve the learning environment for the students

Hashimi Microscopes from St Thomas Aquinas School, Bletchley

The Science teacher and her students were overjoyed at the new microscopes and overhead projector they were able to purchase with the £1,500 raised by students and parents of St Thomas Aquinas School, Bletchley in December 2003. This is another great example of the benefit of linking between schools here in UK and Jordan



Zarka, Jordan, new computer suite project

Fr Fares showed Trustee David Smith the large well lit room once used for typewriting classes. He wants to turn it into a new computer suite of thirty work stations for the school students as well as evening classes for young adults. This will provide a double benefit to the local community. It will enhance the school and also



the local economy with computer based work skills. **The total cost of the project will be £20,000 and the Trust is now looking for parishes or schools who are willing to take on a part or the whole of this project.** Zarka is the second largest city in Jordan and used to be a military town.



Misdar School links with Bedford

Misdar School links with St Joseph's Parish and St Gregory's School Bedford who will fund a new computer suite. Fr Seamus said "I wanted to bring the people of my parish together and it has helped us by doing this project with Fr Yacoub at Misdar School in Jordan.

The parish has responded magnificently and by May 2004 we had raised £9,000 of the £11,600 needed. I am now thinking of taking a group from the parish out to Jordan in 2005 to visit Misdar School and then go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem".



Tribute to Tim Kennedy, Founder Trustee

Founder Trustee Wing Commander Tim Kennedy MBE DFC KSG KGCHS who died on April 4th 2004 after a long illness maintained his trusteeship of CNT until January this year. After a career in the RAF starting in the war years he trained for the teaching profession in Cambridge in 1970 and taught in Cambridge for a number of years. He was devoted to his profession and to the betterment of educational opportunities for Palestinian children in the Holy Land. He was an inspiration to us all involved in the work of the Cambridge Nazareth Trust.



Jifna new school project in memory of Tim Kennedy

Fr Rijk told Trustee David Smith at Easter that US AID is funding a brand new elementary school in Jifna, which is a Palestinian village near Jerusalem and Ramallah. The school is due to be completed in the summer 2004. David Smith, on behalf of the Trust, offered funding for education resources for the new school. **The Trust is now looking for parishes or schools who are willing to take on this project.** Fr Rijk was delighted to agree that this CNT project would be in memory of Founder Trustee Tim Kennedy. His comment on their current situation is "We feel isolated from the rest of the Christians in the world. Local unemployment is high and the village economy is now very run down."
